Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19) Pandemic

Summary

This is an update to the CARPHA Situation Report published on May 11, 2020, in relation to the outbreak of COVID-19.


To date, there are 17,317 cases in 33 countries/territories (including 24 CARPHA Member States), in the Caribbean Region. The risk of further importation of cases to the rest of the Caribbean remains **Very High**. The overarching goal is for all countries to control the pandemic by slowing down the transmission and reducing mortality associated with COVID-19.

The Regional Coordinating Mechanism for Health Security (RCM-HS), continues to work with Heads of Government and key partners on a region-wide approach to the COVID-19 response. At this time, much of the current focus centers around developing and implementing national strategies for a phased lifting of restrictions in CARPHA Member States, while ensuring that appropriate social distancing measures are maintained for continued population safety.




SITUATION UPDATE

COVID-19 in the Caribbean

Since the previous report on May 11, 2020, an additional 756 cases of COVID-19 were confirmed in 12 countries within the Caribbean, bringing the region's total confirmed cases to 17,317 in 33 countries/territories. This new total represents a 5% increase in the number of confirmed cases. There were 728 deaths recorded in the Caribbean region as at May 13, 2020.

COVID-19 SURVEILLANCE AND EPIDEMIOLOGY






As of May 13, 2020, the WHO reported 4,139,794 cases of patients with COVID-19. A total of 215 countries, areas or territories have confirmed at least one case among travellers exposed while abroad and/or person-to-person contact.

No new countries reported their first confirmed case of COVID-19 since the last Situation Report on May 11, 2020. Figure 1 shows a breakdown of cases by Region.

Figure 1: Reported Cases of COVID-19 by Region as of 13 May, 2020*


ANALYSIS OF CASES AMONG CARPHA MEMBER STATES



As of May 13, 2020, there have been 1,712 cases confirmed from CARPHA Member States (CMS), the highest number was reported on April 15, 2020. (Figure 2).


Data in Figure 2 was extracted from official reports published by Ministries of Health in Member States, and numbers may vary based on the time the information was extracted.

Figure 2. Confirmed Cases in Member States as of May 13, 2020



For the cases for which data was available, the majority were aged 50 years and over, with 50-59 being the modal age group. There was no age reported for the majority of cases (1,446) which are excluded from this chart (Figure 3).





Figure 4. Percentage of Confirmed Cases of COVID-19 by sex in CMS, n=764

Among cases for whom sex was reported, 56% were female and 44% were male. (Figure 4).

Among cases for whom a source of infection was reported, 28% were imported; and 54% appeared to be close contacts (local transmission) of a known imported case (Figure 5).



Among the 24 Member States, 58% (14/24) have been classified as having sporadic cases; and 42% (10/24) have reported clusters, based on data received by WHO from national authorities by 10:00 CEST, May 10, 2020¹ (Figure 6).

Figure 6. Category of Countries by Transmission Classification




Figure 7. COVID-19 Progression in CMS*. Laboratory Confirmed New Cases. Feb—May

<u>Laboratory</u>

Since February 10, 2020 and as of May 12, 2020, CARPHA has received 3,855 samples from 16 CMS, 426 (11.1%) of which have tested positive since the start of the outbreak, 249 results (6.5%) correspond to unique new cases.

Figure 7 shows the progression of COVID-19 cases which have been confirmed in CMS from February – May 2020.

CARPHA'S COVID-19 RESPONSE

Laboratory Update

CARPHA's COVID-19 Testing Process and Adherence to Quality Standards

The CARPHA Medical Microbiology Laboratory (CMML) currently tests all suspected cases of COVID-19, as per the WHO case definition, provided by the WHO Global surveillance for COVID-19 caused by human infection with COVID-19 virus.

The CMML uses the WHO recommended Polymerase Chain Reaction (PCR) method. This method remains the gold standard for COVID-19 laboratory diagnosis because the sensitivity and specificity of the test are nearly 100%. Read more. Video: The CARPHA **COVID-19 Testing Process**

IMT-ER Update

CARPHA's Technical Cooperation

May 7, 2020: CARPHA in collaboration with the CARICOM Implementation Agency for Crime and Security (IMPACS) conducted a Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) Training for Law Enforcement Officers session, targeting officers responsible for ports of entry and investigations in CARICOM Member States. In attendance were members of the in the police force, customs, coast guard, immigration, military and prisons. The training was facilitated through the Caribbean Basin Security Initiative virtual platform, CBSI- masks to members of CARPHA's staff. Connect and the Trinidad and Tobago Police Training Academy.

More than 500 law enforcement professionals from across 20 CARPHA Member States (15 CARICOM Members and 5 Associate States) attended the virtual session in addition to other regional organizations - the OECS and the RSS. Countries represented included Anguilla, Antigua and Barbuda, Bahamas, Barbados, Belize, Bermuda, Cayman Islands, Dominica, Grenada, Guyana, Haiti, Jamaica, St. Kitts, St. Lucia, St. Vincent and the Grenadines, Suriname, Trinidad and Tobago. The largest contingent being from Jamaica (126). Trinidad and Tobago had 5 virtual classrooms as well as 60 individuals signed on to the virtual training. The session has been dubbed to be one of, if not the most subscribed session held on the platform. CARPHA continues to collaborate with CARICOM IMPACS to strengthen preparedness and response on the frontline.

CARPHA is working closely with various stakeholders for a coordinated regional response, and as such has engaged with multiple stakeholders in multiple ways, including the following meetings that Dr. St. John and Dr. Indar participated in:

- May 13, 2020: International Airlines and Travel Partners CARICOM common position re COVID-19.
- May 13, 2020: Meeting with the Center for Diseases Control Vessel Sanitation program to discuss repatriation by cruse ships .
- May 12, 2020: Caribbean COVID-19 Tourism Task Force to discuss re-opening of borders proactive COVID-19 tourism measures.
- May 11, 2020: CARICOM meeting of the Chief Medical Officers to discuss Repatriation, with a focus on criteria for repatriation of crew workers via cruise ships
- May 9, 2020: "Consultations with Labour and Private Sector Leaders" to solicit input from labour and private sector leaders to on proposed protocols for re-opening of the Caribbean to travel.
