**\*Fully vaccinated: 2 weeks after their second dose in a 2-dose series, such as the Pfizer or Moderna vaccines, or 2 weeks after a single-dose vaccine, such as Johnson & Johnson's Janssen vaccine. \*\*Anguilla and Dominican Republic requires 3 weeks. \*\*\* Guadeloupe & Martinique requires 7 days after 2-dose series (Pfizer, Moderna, AstraZeneca), 4 weeks (Johnson & Johnson), 2 weeks after the injection (only one injection required) of a vaccine in people who have already had a history of Covid-19. \*\*\*\*Mixed vaccines accepted (Pfizer, Moderna, AstraZeneca, Janssen & Johnson, Sinopharm, Sinovac, Sputnik V) \*\*\*\*\* required to have received at least one dose of a World Health Organization (WHO) or Ministry of Health Wellness and the Environment (MOHWE) approved 2-dose COVID 19 vaccine or a single dose vaccine**

Please note some jurisdictions restrict movement for a period of time upon arrival, either within a designated area, hotel grounds or a corridor within the destination. Most jurisdictions currently allow movement within the countries/territories with adherence to masking and physical distancing upon arrival and proof of negative tests as a requirement for entry. Individuals testing positive upon arrival should be prepared to be isolated until they test negative. The quarantine period for fully vaccinated\* individuals who test negative will be waived or reduced. Destination links should be checked regularly for more details and updates.
